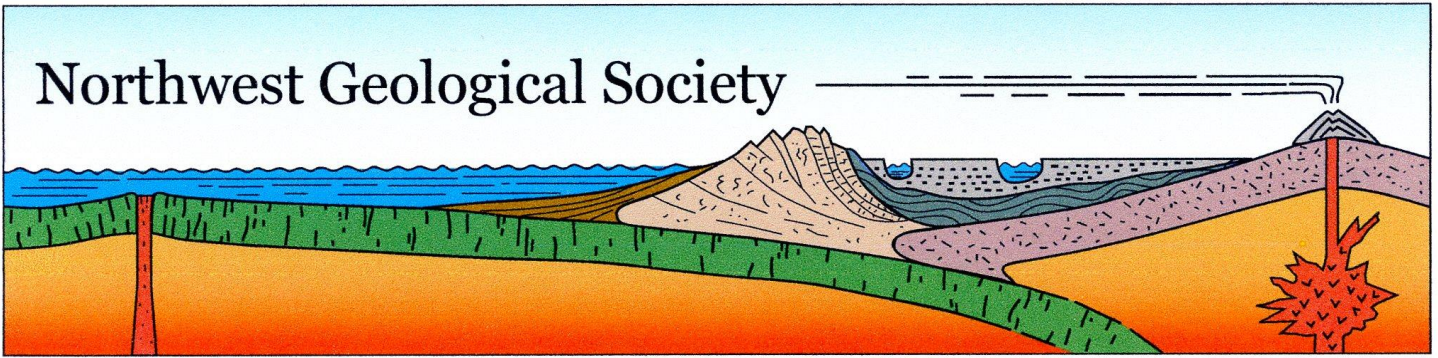

Annotated references listed as footnotes (smaller font) at bottom or back of page.**
