January 12 Program Speaker

Speaker: Richard S. Fiske, Smithsonian Institution

Title: Submarine Convergent-Margin Pyroclastic Volcanism

**Speaker Abstract:** One of Earth's most important present-day pyroclastic environments is both out of sight and almost totally out of mind. Tonight we inspect the submarine volcanic pile lying along the Izu-Bonin arc south of Japan, where thick pyroclastic aprons and Crater-Lake size rhyolitic calderas are found 100s of meters below sea level. mid-ocean-ridge volcanism, most of which are eventually subducted away, submarine convergent margin volcanic terrains tend to be accreted onto continents and preserved in thick, often mineralized (e.g. economically valuable!) greentuff and greenstone successions. In a nostalgic conclusion, we revisit the Ohanapecosh Formation in and near Mount Rainier National Park, where the concept of angleof-repose transport of pyroclastic debris along subaqueous slopes was first proposed.

Photo Spotlight

Aerial view of the Naches landslide looking northwest along SR 410 ~10 miles west of Naches, Wash. The landslide occurred at ~6 a.m. on Sunday, October 11 (central part of photo, cutting across highway), which moved southwestward from the northeastern valley wall of the Naches River, and was estimated to be ~1/4 mile wide and 40 feet deep. The landslide pushed up a 1/4 mile section of SR 410 and moved it into the Naches River and completely crossed the river, causing flooding in the vicinity.
