January 11 Program Speaker

Speaker: Darrel Cowan, UW Earth and Space Sciences **Title:** Active, possibly seismogenic, low-angle normal

faults, Death Valley, California

Abstract: Death Valley, California, is a NNW-striking halfgraben that is extending due to slip on active west-dipping normal faults along its eastern edge. The fault system in-

cludes gently dipping segments, which are popularly called *low-angle normal faults* or *detachment faults*. The hanging walls consist of upper Quaternary debris -flow and alluvial-fan strata; the footwalls are Proterozoic gneiss and carbonate rocks. We investigated the fault rocks developed along the detachments, which dip 19°-30°, and relate their origin to total shear strain that increases upward to the principal slip surface. We present evidence that slip has occurred on the detachment faults, while they were at their present gentle dips, since about 120 Ka. We infer that the typical steep scarps at the mountain front, which all would interpret as having formed during earthquakes, indicate that the detachments are active. We hypothesize that seismic slip can nucleate on the detachments beneath Death Valley at seismogenic depths.
