## **November 11 Program Speaker**

<u>Speaker</u>: Jeff Tepper, Geology Dept., Univ. Puget Sound <u>Title</u>: Diverse Environmental Histories of Tacoma Area Lakes: Deciphering the 12,000 Year Sediment Record <u>Abstract</u>: Within the Puget Lowlands are numerous lakes, many of which occupy kettles that formed roughly 12,000 years ago as the ice lobe that occupied this region was melt-

ing. The sediment within these lakes thus preserves a long record of Holocene environmental history that includes both natural and anthropogenic changes. Recent work by UPS faculty and students on four adjacent lakes near Tacoma (American, Gravelly, Louise, and Waughop) has revealed surprising diversity in both their "plumbing" (water sources) and their recent (last ~150 years) environmental histories. Agricultural activity and ASARCO smelter fallout in particular impacted these lakes, but the responses of individual water bodies have varied greatly. For example, Gravelly Lake has exceptionally clear water while Waughop Lake experiences toxic algal blooms. This talk will describe how we have integrated sediment core analyses, geochronology, and water chemistry to better understand both the past and present day conditions of these lakes.
