eral decades the scientific community has experienced significant progress in geochronologic dating techniques. This has lead towards an expansion in both the age range and materials available for geologic dating. Combined with other geologic information, such as geochemistry, geophysics, and paleontology, these new and improved dating techniques have revolutionized our ability to peer into Earth's past. This aim of this talk is to provide a review of recent advancements of geochronology given in the context of geologic studies conducted both near and far: from our backyards in eastern Washington to the top of the Tibetan Plateau.




### Announcements


