Abstract:

Leave your hiking boots at home for this virtual field trip to some of America's iconic landscapes. Through the three National Parks we will climb about 10,000 feet of sedimentary column representing diverse depositional environments. Some short diversions into Grand Staircase Escalante National Monument beckon on our traverse. Here's your chance to become friends of the Paleozoic, Mesozoic and lower Tertiary exposures in Arizona and Utah. Some favorite hikes are recommended for those who may want to follow up with a real visit.
