May 8 Program Speaker

Speaker: Eric Cheney, UW Earth & Space Sciences Emeritus

Title: When Did the Cascade Range Rise?

<u>Abstract</u>: The Cascade Range is not 30 to 40 Ma. Flora in the Miocene Columbia River Basalt Group (CRBG) and overlying 12 Ma Ellensburg Formation record no rain shadow (hence no significant mountains).

The SSW striking Cascade Range anticlinorium (CRA) is outlined clearly on the east by easterly dipping CRBG. The mostly covered western limb consists of Ellensburg-correlative formations in westerly trending synclines and fault blocks that together define the SSW striking Puget synclinorium.

The 4 Ma Thorp Gravel and Simcoe Mountains basaltic rocks on the E limb of the CRA dip 3°-5° E. A trend surface on 205 peaks in the southern Cascades that are underlain by > 5 Ma rocks is antiformal, doubly plunging, SSW striking, and has relief of 1.4 km. In the Brightwater tunnel on the eastern limb of the Puget synclinorium, the 65 to 80 ka Possession Drift descends westward 43 m in 11 km.
