### Letter from NWGS President Katie Bower

Dear NWGS Membership,

This has been a most challenging year for all of us as we continue to struggle with the COVID-19 pandemic. I hope you are all staying safe and healthy in its wake.

The Board of Directors has confirmed the unfortunate reality that we will not be able to meet in person again for some time. As I understand it, we are currently in Phase II of the planned phased reopening for Washington State, with groups of 10 or more not allowed until Phase IV. We have a long road to go, with an expected possible resurgence of cases this coming winter. Therefore all of our in-person meetings, as well as field trips, are cancelled for the foreseeable future.

That said, the Board and I are reaching out to you, our members and friends, to let you know we are working on the possible avenue of online webinar meetings to reconnect us as a group so we will remain safe, yet social about geology. It is unknown at this point in time whether we will be able to have our usual October meeting (online webinar), but we are working to that schedule. You will receive plenty of notice, if and when we have webinar meetings set up. Because of this new change and moving our meetings to an online format, we have created a new board position as NWGS Technology Officer. We will need someone with technology know-how to operate, administrate and assist members with webinar meetings, a willingness to participate in board meetings and decisions, with a possibility of managing the website as well. We would also like to let you know that if you are a paid 2020 member, that your 2021 dues will be waived in light of all the cancellations.
