**Speaker:** Gordon Grant, USDA Forest Service, The Hydraulics of High-Energy Geologic Fluids (or the Physics of Whitewater)

Abstract: If you've ever wondered why some rivers have whitewater, and what that tells us about underlying processes of fluids on Planet Earth, this talk will answer those questions and more. Starting with rivers, and then on to lava flows, I will explore the physics (easy!) of whitewater, and implications for interpreting a variety of geological phenomena on Earth and even other planets!
