Speaker: Paul Belanger, Sound Water Stewards, Paleoceanographic history that led to our understanding of Cenozoic climate history and changing impact for the Pacific Northwest

Abstract: This presentation will review the Paleoceanographic coring and drilling research program from the 1950s:

- a. confirmed continental drift,
- b. led to a snapshot of the world 18,000 years ago (CLIMAP) as well as detailed ice volume history
- c. clarified our ice age history and the relationship of orbital parameters (Milankovitch cycles) leading to high resolution chemo stratigraphy
- d. correlated those records to Ice Core CO₂ levels and greater understanding of the interrelationship of CO₂ and orbital influences.
- e. documented the long draw-down of CO₂ in the Cenozoic from the Eocene thermal optimum to our present Ice-House Earth with its interglacials and glacial-stadials and interstadials.
- f. this has become the physical science basis for the IPCC reports on climate change and our global warming concerns.
- g. and how those concerns will impact us in the PNW as I've learned through SWS.
