Title: Glaciovolcanic Cave Research in the Cascade Volcanic Arc

Abstract: Glaciovolcanism can be found on several volcanoes worldwide and has received substantial attention during the last few decades. However, a rarely studied phenomenon related to volcano-ice interactions is the formation of void spaces underneath the ice—glaciovolcanic caves. Although supposed to exist on many glacier-mantled volcanoes worldwide, studies remain limited to volcanoes in Antarctica and the Cascade Volcanic Arc in the United States and Canada. This talk briefly outlines the global distribution of glaciovolcanic caves, highlights ongoing research advances, and illustrates their relevance to modern society. Focus is given to the crater of Mount St. Helens, Mount Rainier, and the slopes of Mount Hood. At Mount St. Helens a novel system of glaciovolcanic caves is circumnavigating the 2004-2008 lava dome. Between 2014 and 2021, more than three kilometers of passages were discovered and mapped, with further exploration being planned. The summit of Mount Rainier contains the world's largest cave of this type, and studies reveal dynamism over a 50-year timeframe. At Mount Hood, glacial retreat has substantially shortened extensive cave systems in recent years.


