Title: Hiking Cougar Mountain During COVID Times

Abstract: The Cougar Mountain and Coal Creek parks are major recreational resources for the Seattle metropolitan area, enjoyed by large numbers of visitors who enjoy the scenic beauty, while little appreciating the underlying geology. This talk is an outgrowth of a personal pandemic project to hike all the trails of Cougar Mountain (multiple times) relating the trail network to the geology and the mining history that is particularly well expressed in the DNR's accessible LIDAR and the coal mine map databases. The talk will draw on a field trip guide that was prepared for the AEG's first post-COVID meeting drawing on these resources as well as those of the Newcastle Historical Society. These include geo-PDF's of the Lidar imagery that can be uploaded to popular hiking aides like Avenza. Some highlights of the talk include a geologic overview, mining history and sinkhole development, and rockfalls their possible origins.


