Speaker: Carl L. Carlson, Carlson Brothers Jewelry, Tacoma Title: The Veins of Ellensburg Blue Agate

Abstract: This is contrary to the teaching on the Ellensburg Blue as the literature describes it being formed in the Teanaway Basalt vesicles and being brought into the farm lands at the base of the mountains by glacier waters. This is not the way my dad and I found them in 39 years of mining them. What the veins taught me from the field observations was why they are where they are, the associ-ations to look for when searching for them, and the variations of blue color observed in the different veins. With the microscopes and lighting, a characteristic inclusion can be seen, I have never seen it in any other agate.
