Speaker: Ken Petrie, Senior Geologist, Weyerhaeuser Title: Carbon Capture and Sequestration Overview

Abstract: Carbon capture and Sequestration (CCS) is just one tool to aid in the effort to decarbonize and meet climate goals. Scientists have studied CCS for decades, with the DOE funding a handful of small-scale projects. The passage of 45Q legislation and enhancement of the associated tax credit in recent years has resulted in the rapid expansion of players in the CCS industry. Although companies have applied for Class VI injection wells and developed injection plans, there are regulatory, economic, and social hurdles to overcome before widespread deployment can begin. This talk provides an overview of CCS, including a view on how to remove obstacles, and move projects beyond the evaluation phase. The talk concludes with the state of CCS in the Pacific Northwest.


